

In the project entitled "Dots per individua", four young Macedonian artists, Gordana Vrencoska, Igor Sekovski, Stanislava Šarović and Boris Šemov, appear to have a different way of exploring the computer graphics, which is one of the starting points that links the authors. The project's title emerges from the utilized medium and represents an allusion of the term DPI (a measurement for digital graphics resolution i.e. the quality of the picture that depends on the number of the points).

The starting "material" of the works is the photography, which in the further process of its development undergoes transformation. The artwork is based on the principle of the analysis and/or synthesis of the fragments from/in the wholeness. Apart from the similarities of the techniques being used, the members of this self-organized group insist on the individual approach towards the problems of space, dynamics, urbanity, referring to the realization of this compact exhibition. Moreover, differences are the starting point for the group's credo: the higher is the number of points of view - the better is the picture.

In the diptych "Beauty must die", Gordana Vrencoska analyses the moment of experiencing something she defines as a beauty. The inconsistency and the passing by of "the moment of the beauty" as well as the feeling for it, are suggested through the concrete appearances which gradually fade away, dissolving in diffused fragments of structures, forms and colors.

Boris Semov creates a synthesis of different fragments into an organic unity, in order to demonstrate the experience of the urban living phenomenon. The metamorphoses deriving from the psychological condition ("Sleeplessness") are presented in the mental pictures sprouting out of the darkness, vibrating in the well-known visual information of the daily routine.

The experience of the intensive urban living is also present in the work of **Igor Sekovski**, but with (more or less) minimal solutions in his "S-lines - during" and "S-lines - after". The daily subway ride is brought to the simple linear expressions of the trajectories of the railroad, presented in one of his previous room installations. In this case the lines appear to be multiplied and decomposed.

In the composition "Circle", Stanislava Sarović explores the construction of the space by dissolving the elements of the perspective - the different points of attraction and repulsion. Mostly by the juxtaposition of photographs, emphasized with graphical interventions, she reaches the effect of the counter perspective.
